DCFD Driver Training Checklist

1. Drive Time in Engine
 - a. 3 Hours daytime driving on highway and narrow roads in response area
 - b. 1 Hour nighttime driving on highway and narrow roads in response area
 - c. These are minimum requirements, Trainer/Station Commander has the ability to require additional time as needed.
2. Successfully Pumping assigned Engine with Trainer(s) – 1 hour minimum, using the following checklist:
 - a. Drafting from Water Source
 - i. Using Prime to obtain Draft
 - ii. Using Alternative Draft Options (i.e. Burp Drafting or Pressurized Prime)
 - b. Charging one handline at specific pressure(s)
 - c. Charging two handlines at specific pressure(s)
 - d. Operate Deck Gun
3. Successfully filling Engine at hydrant
4. Successfully demonstrate/understand the appropriate fill site setup with 2-3" Supply line from hydrant with 2 Hydrant Gate Valves and 2-3" Supply lines with Quick Connect that would connect to the Tanker and know the correct pressures to refill Engine/Tanker.
5. Complete FF111 Basic Pump Operator Course
6. Station Commander must certify that Trainee is proficient in Drive time and Pump Time with assigned Engine
7. Trainee must demonstrate to Lieutenant/Captain/Assistant Chief (Only 1 Officer) in training exercise how to pump Engine when arriving on scene.
8. Once Station Commander and Officer have signed Driver Training log, the Trainee may be submitted to the Chief for Final Approval

****These requirements are set to empower Firefighters who operate an Engine on scene to be confident in their skills, abilities, and knowledge with clear expectations and to hold each member accountable.**

DCFD Member Driving Re-Evaluation:

Any Station Commander who deems that a member of DeKalb County Fire Department is not proficient in either driving or pumping their assigned Engine, the Station Commander and their assigned Lieutenant or Captain may report this member to the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee will then determine whether additional training is needed. If additional training is needed, the member's driving privilege in DCFD equipment will be revoked, until sufficient training has been completed and signed off by Station Commander, 1 DCFD Officer, and Chief.
